Also, tune in to the last chapter of 'Dadventure!'


CORE LEARNING TASK FOR MATHEMATICS

Today in maths we are again looking at the written method for division by using chunking. This is a key skill so we are going to give you the time to practice it further and to become confident.

Top tip- don't forget to write your fact box of key multiples before you begin.

Division by Chunking (Short Division)

Recall of multiplication tables helps make this method more efficient, e.g. 72 ÷ 3.



1x 3 2x 6 5x 15 10x 30 Children should write key facts in a menu box. This will help them in identifying the largest group they can subtract in one chunk. Lancashire
