Core Learning Tasks for Tuesday 24th March 2020




CORE LEANING TASK FOR ENGLISH

Listen to the story of Superworm by Julia Donaldson. If you already own the book, that is perfect! If not, Google Superworm! Story Train Read aloud for kids. Watch the video reading the story. Join in with the chant:

"Superworm is super-long, Superworm is super strong. Watch him wiggle! See him squirm! Hip, hip, hooray for SUPERWORM!"

- Who are the main characters? Do you like Superworm? Why?
- Who are the bad characters? How do you know?
- What can Superworm do that gives him super powers? How does he help his minibeast friends?
- Think of some words to describe Superworm kind, helpful, strong.
- Discuss new vocabulary in the text, such as squirm, coil, writhe. These words are also our Wonder Words in the Learning Overview.
- Listen to the words that rhyme in the story. Which words rhyme, or sound the same?

On Thursday, there will be a written task to complete as a Core Learning Task. Enjoy this fantastic story a couple of times so that the children become familiar with the sequence of events.




CORE LEARNING TASK FOR MATHEMATICS

Please complete the assigned tasks on Mathletics. Your username and passcode is in the Remote Learning book.

Explore Espresso on Discovery Education. Your login and password is in the Remote Learning book. Hover over the Foundation area and select Maths, then Numbers 0-20.

Begin by watching the 3 videos. The last video on 11-20 focuses on making teen numbers. Have a go at making a line of ten objects, then adding one more, to make 11. Say *let's add one more* as you do it. Then continue up to 20, when you will have two lines of ten. Use the language *one ten and 5 units* to describe 15. You could build the teen numbers using pennies, counters, smarties, marbles, buttons...anything! Be creative – it could be daisies, pebbles, leaves! Record your teen numbers in your Remote Learning book like this below. Please ensure that the 1 digit is directly underneath the ten, etc.
