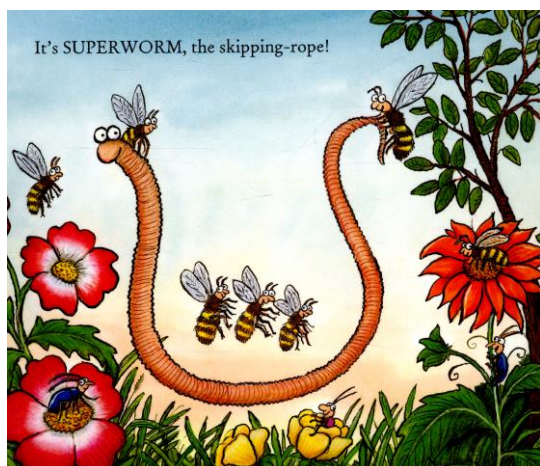


CORE LEARNING TASK FOR ENGLISH

Continue our learning around 'Superworm'.

Re-enact the story with props. You could gather objects from around the house to 'imagine' that they are Wizard Lizard's magic, purple flower and his hat. You could even use an old sock and stuff it with newspaper to make Superworm, or use your skipping rope as Superworm! Mums, dads, sisters, brothers take part too, if you like!

Use the sheet in your learning pack with pictures of Superworm coming to the rescue in all different ways. Cut them out and write underneath each one. Superworm, the _____. Please do this phonetically, using your alphabet mat to help.



CORE LEARNING TASK FOR MATHEMATICS

Please complete the assigned tasks on Mathletics. Your username and passcode are in the Remote Learning book.

Today we are going to focus on addition. Can you add two numbers together to find the total?

Make 12 worms. You could draw them and cut them out, make them out of play dough or even use sticks from your garden!

Then, roll a dice (if you don't have a dice, write the numbers 1-6 on separate pieces of paper and put them into a cup and choose a number). Collect this number of worms. Roll the dice again (or choose another number) and collect this number of worms. How many worms do you have altogether?

Have a go at writing the number sentence in your Remote Learning Book, for example; $3 + 5 = 8$

If appropriate, to extend your learning cover up the largest amount, write the number of worms on top and then count on from this number to find the total. Also, you could try adding two larger numbers together, for example; $8 + 6$ or $9 + 4$.

A strategy for counting on mentally 'in our head' is like this: Say, "8 in my head, count on two more." Hold up two fingers. Then say, "...9, 10." Begin by counting small numbers - 2, 3 or 4 more.

In school, the children have been practising making the + and = sign using their arms. Encourage them to do this and to talk about what they are doing, for example; I have 4 worms. I am going to add 4 more. I have 8 altogether.
