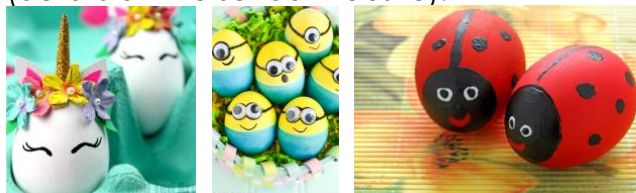
Easter Ideas

RE FOCUS

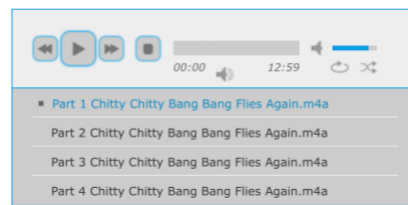
Look at the wealth of information about the Christian holiday of Easter available on Espresso. Present this information in an information booklet with a contents page and glossary.
