- A Write your own acrostic poem.
- **B** ake using a new recipe.

- **D** Draw a detailed self portrait.
- E Hand embroider your own picture or create an e-card.
- Write 100 words explaining how the Arts give you freedom or perform your own fashion show.
- G Dance to the Peer Gynt Suite 'In the Hall of the Mountain King' by Edvard Grieg or design and make your own family board game.
- **H** Hot seat your favourite character from a book.
- Design and make your own musical instrument or illustrate your favourite book.
- J Watch Flash Mob Gustav Holst The Planets: Jupiter. Name the instruments and describe how the music makes you feel. What is name of the well-known 1921 hymn?
- **K** Build and fly your own **k**ite or recreate your own *Tree of Life* by Gustav **K**limt.
- Learn a short poem by heart and perform it or learn how to greet a friend in a new language.
- M Use **m**ime and **m**ovement to perform a poem or song.
- Nature: create a piece of outdoor artwork using only **n**atural objects.

- O Create your own simple **O**p Art (**O**ptical Art) inspired by Bridget Riley or Victor Vasarely.
