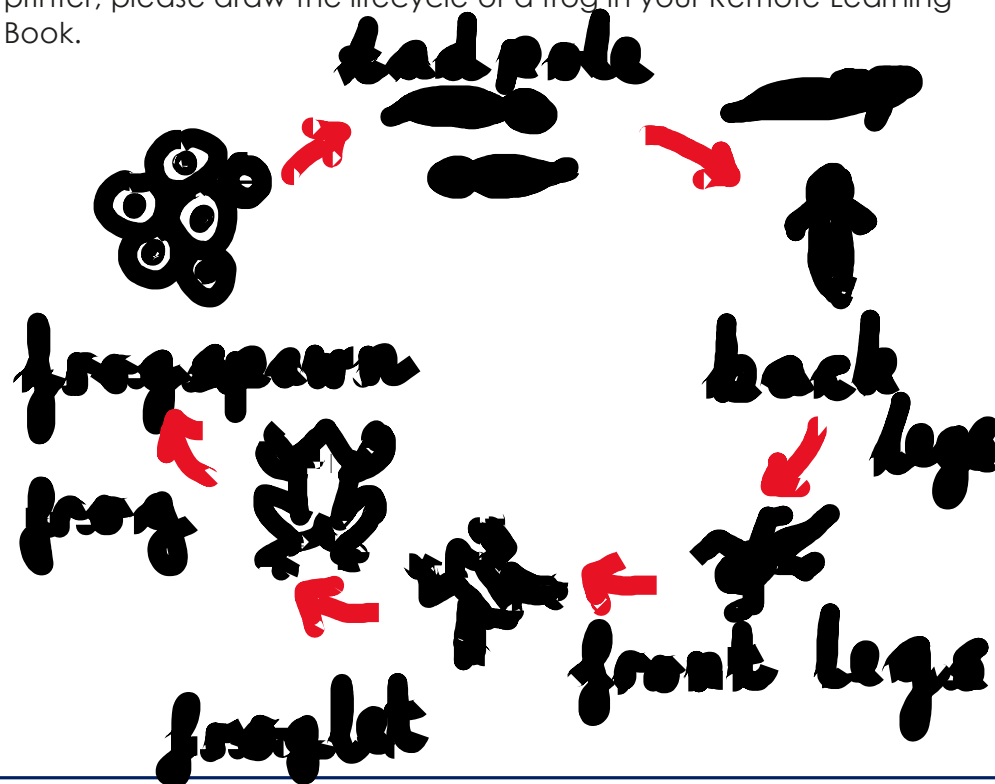


CORE LEARNING TASK FOR ENGLISH

Watch the *Come Outside – Frogs* episode. Search on google.

Watch the video of Mrs Brown reading *Leaping Frogs* part 2, which is about the lifecycle of a frog. (Provided in Remote Learning, week 4).

Cut out the pictures of the lifecycle of a frog. (Provided in Remote Learning, week 4). Stick them in a circle as illustrated below. Colour them in and write a caption next to each part. If you have no printer, please draw the lifecycle of a frog in your Remote Learning Book.



CORE LEARNING TASK FOR MATHEMATICS

Please complete the assigned tasks on Mathletics.

Today we are going to compare sets of up to 20 objects using the words 'more,' 'less,' 'least' and 'fewer.' You will need numbers to 20 written on paper and cut out.

- Place numbers 1-20 in a bag and pull two numbers out. (Extend this to numbers to 30, if appropriate.) Comparing two numbers close together is more challenging. E.g. number 13 and number 17.
- Read the numbers out loud and write them down. Find them on your number line.
- Make both amounts, using objects/toys from around your house or garden. Keep them in two groups. Be sure to count accurately, pointing to each object. Look at the two groups. Ask:
Which group has **more**? (To challenge, ask *How many more*?)
Which group has **less**? (To challenge, ask *How many less*?)
Which group has the **least** counters?
Which group has the **most** counters?
Which group has **fewer**? Spend some extra time explaining the word **fewer**.

Then model the child's response as a sentence. For example, "There are fewer cars than dinosaurs." Can they explain WHY they know? "Because the number 9 is smaller than the number 12." Encourage them to use their learning of tens and units. "Number 15 has one ten and 5 units, but number 12 has one ten and 2 units. So number 12 is less than number 15."
