CORE LEARNING TASKS FOR MATHEMATICS

FOCUS- MONEY

By the end of Year 2, children are expected to recognise and use the symbols for pounds (\pounds) and pence (p). They are also expected to combine particular amounts of money Children also need to find different combinations of coins that equal the same amounts and understand how to give change. At school, we encourage children to know how many pennies equal £1(100p), £2 (200p). £3 (300p)

Activities that will help with understanding Money:

How many different ways can you make a total?

Using money, find out how many different ways you can make the same total. (For example, how many ways can you make 35p). Why don't you try to make different amounts to total pounds? (How many ways can you make £1.30 etc.

What have I bought?

Being a shopkeeper!

Play shops with someone in your house. Give each item a price and then practice giving change to the person who buys it. e.g. An orange is 30p. Mum buys an orange for 50p. How much change does she get? Again challenge yourself by using pounds!

3D SHAPE OF THE WEEK: Square based Pyramid

This week, we would like the children to to learn and produce a poster/factfile all about a **Square based Pyramid**. How many curved or straight edges, curved or flat faces does it have? What shape are its faces? Does it have any vertices? Can it be stacked or rolled? Can you identify any examples of **Square based Pyramids** in everyday life? How is a **Square based Pyramid** different to a **Triangular Prism?**
