
Please follow the slides found on the remote learning site detailing what we are going to do and use the resources to influence your investigations.

History

Our topic this half term is Vikings and Anglo Saxons. This week we are going to be investigating and using the language used, in particular, by the Vikings but also used by the Saxons. By the Viking age, the writing system was called the Younger Futhark which consisted of 24 sounds. We are going to look at and use a runic alphabet that uses 28 characters. These were used to stamp authority of ownership. 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MATHS CORE LEARNING TASKS MENTAL METHODS FOR SUBTRACTION.

MONDAY - Developing strategies to subtract numbers mentally.

Watch the video that I have made for you which will introduce to two methods that can help you subtract numbers mentally. Then follow the Maths Monday slides and answer the questions provided, in your Remote Learning book.

<u>TUESDAY</u> - **Developing further strategies to add numbers mentally.**

Watch the video that I have made for you which will introduce you to another method that can help you subtract numbers mentally. In the video I will also introduce examples of subtracting decimal numbers mentally. Then follow the Maths Tuesday slides and answer the questions provided, in your Remote Learning book.

<u>WEDNESDAY</u> – Using a written method for subtraction.

Watch the video that I have made for you which will show and remind you of the formal written method for subtraction. Follow the Maths Wednesday slides and answer the questions provided, in your Remote Learning book.

THURSDAY – Using a written method for subtraction.

Watch the video that I have made for you which will remind you of the formal written method that you have used in Year 4. We will look at extending to include decimal number subtractions as well. Follow the Maths Thursday slides which give you a chance to practise this method with increasingly large numbers and decimal numbers.

FRIDAY – Solving addition and subtraction word problems.

Today we will continue to practise the written methods for both addition and subtraction but seeing them set out slightly differently. We will concentrate on the strategies used within word problems. Watch the video before completing Maths Friday slides.

ENGLISH CORE LEARNING TASKS

The Legend of Gelert

<u>MONDAY</u> – Identifying how a characters emotions change through a story.

Follow the **English Monday** slides. You will need to read through the story of Gelert **(Resource 1)**, and follow the slides to understand the notion of an emotions graph **(Resource 2)**. After seeing me model the first three emotions complete the emotions graph for the story.

<u>TUESDAY</u> – Writing about how a characters emotions change through a story.

Follow the **English Tuesday** slides. Thinking back to the previous day and looking at characters emotions throughout a story I would like you to write a diary entry from the point of view of Llewelyn. I have started an example on the slides and I would like you to complete it. Think about the key events in chronological order and how the characters emotions change during the diary entry. Write as if you were Llewelyn.

WEDNESDAY- Creating sentences using relative pronouns and relative clauses.

Follow the **English Wednesday** slides. . Watch the video found here https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Yo4y_37c_Dc&safe=active on relative pronouns. Identify the relative clause within the sentence (**Resource 3**) and then look at the relative clauses questions which needs to be written into your RL books (**Resource 4**).

and complete quiz 1 one at the end. Then complete the Wyrmstooth crown game (Resource 5) in your remote learning books.

Follow the **English Friday** slides. Rewatch the espresso clip from the previous day before completing quiz 2 and the activity. Then I would like you to generate 10 sentences that could be used in the 'Legend of Gelert' using the bank of main clauses **(Resource 6)** and your own ideas.
