CORE LEARNING TASK

Today, we are going to recall the story of The Three Billy Goats Gruff. Watch the video again from yesterday to remind you of the story.

Ask an adult to print out the sequencing cards on today's page. Cut up the cards and place them in the correct order, as the events happened in the story. If you can't print the cards, you could draw a grid and draw your own sequence of events.

You could even have a go at writing some captions under the pictures to explain what is happening.

Take a picture of your completed sequencing activity for your Key Worker.

MOTOR SKILLS TASK

Curly Caterpillars – today we are going to practise writing some of our curly caterpillar letters. Use the dotty tracing sheet to practice the correct formation of each letter.

Monster Zig Zags – today we are going to practise writing some of our curly caterpillar letters. Use the dotty tracing sheet to practice the correct formation of each letter.

One Arm Robots – today we are going to practise our cutting skills. Print out the scissor skills activity sheet and use your scissors to cut carefully along the different shaped lines. Think carefully about turning your paper to make following the lines easier.

Ladder Letters – today we are going to practise our writing patterns, using writing equipment. Get out your favourite pens/pencils/felt-tips/chalks/paints. Use the pattern cards in your remote learning pack or the ones on the EYFS page of the school website. First, place a blank sheet of paper over the pattern and try to trace over it. If you can follow the lines carefully, then try to copy the pattern onto a blank sheet of paper. Try to make your patterns look the same each time.

MATHEMATICS TASK

Positional Language:

In the story "The Three Billy Goats Gruff"

the goats walk **over** the bridge and



the troll sits **under** the bridge. This is called **positional** language.

Today we would like you to make some positional cards using the following words...

Rectangles: in, inside, on, under, behind.

Squares: in, inside, on, under, behind, below, above.

Triangles: in, inside, on, under, behind, below, above, next to.

Circles: in, inside, on, under, behind, below, above, next to, between, through.

(Please keep these cards for future work)

Ask your child to collect the goats they made on Monday. Using the goats and directional cards ask the children to place the goats in various places around the house. For example, place the smallest goat under the table. Now place the largest goat behind the curtain etc. Try and use all the positional cards.

PHONICS TASK

BLUES – Can you remember the sound you learnt yesterday? /g/

Today's new sound: **/o/.** Follow the link below and learn all about the sound **/o/** https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zf2yf4j/articles/zjcwd6f

How many objects can you find around your home that begins with the sound /o/?

Practise reading the words: **and** and **on**. Ask a grown-up to hide these words around your home. How many words can you find and read?

YELLOWS - Can you remember the sound you learnt yesterday? /h/

Today's new sound: /b/. Follow the link below and learn all about the sound /b/

Practise reading the tricky words: **no** and **go.** Remember the last letter in these words makes the sound /**oa**/! Don't let them trick you!

Draw a picture of your **bed**, **a bug and a bat**. Can you use your phonics to sound out each word and label your pictures?

REDS – Can you remember the sound you learnt yesterday? /**II**/

Today's new sound: /ss/. Follow the link below and learn all about the sound /ss/https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zf2yf4i/articles/zkbk92p

Practise reading the words **mum** and **dad**.

Ask a grown up to write the words: **miss, mess, less** and **Tess**. Place the words faced down. Choose a word and sound it out. Cover it up and have a go at writing the word. Have a look to see if you are correct. Complete this game for all the words.

PURPLES – please practise all the sounds you have learnt so far in foundation: s/a/t/p/i/n/m/d/g/o/c/k/ck/e/u/r/h/b/f/ff/l/ll/ss. Practise reading the words: **no**, **go**, **his** and **him**. Can you read them without sounding them out? Practise reading and writing the following words: **hug**, **peck**, **fun**, **lap** and **puff**. Now have a go at reading and writing the caption **/go back to bed/** Have a look at Miss Brown's video on seesaw for support.

GREENS—please re-visit the sounds z/zz/y/qu/

How fast can you read the tricky words we, be, me, she and he? Practise reading and writing the following words: yuck, zip, buzz and queen. Read the following funny questions and have a go at answering them: Has a fox got six legs? Has a cot got a web? Is a lemon red? Can a duck quack?
