CORE LEARNING TASK FOR ENGLISH

CORE LEARNING TASK FOR MATHEMATICS

This week our focus is 2D shape and angles.

This morning, we would like you to start with recalling addition and subtraction facts for each number up to 20. Watch the beginning of the tutorial video then have ago at <u>Hit the Button - Quick fire maths</u> practice for 5-11 year olds (topmarks.co.uk) - number bonds- addition within 20 and subtraction within 20.



Today, we will be learning to identify right angles around the room and identifying right angles in shapes.

KEY VOCABULARY

Key vocabulary you will come across this week include *right* angle, acute angle, obtuse angle, horizontal, vertical, perpendicular, parallel, persuasion, techniques. If you are unsure about the meaning of any of these words use Ihesaurus and Word Tools | WordHippo to check their definition or try and work out the meaning from the context in which they are used.

WIDER CURRICULUM TASK

PSHE - LO: To explore and define the term 'diversity'.

Discuss the word **DIVERSITY** and offer suggestions as to what it means, (i.e. difference).

Discuss the questions on the 'Diversity' PDF document available on the Year 3 remote learning page.

TASK 1: Think about your classmates. Complete the table of similarities and differences (of people within the class. e.g.

similarities are age, education etc.

differences are gender, families, behaviour etc.

TASK 2: Create an acrostic poem for the word Diversity - what does it mean? How can it be positive?

Finish off by listening to this story (4) Blue Penguin - YouTube. Discuss what the message of the story is and how we can learn from it.

<u>P.E- Dance LO: to use a variety of speeds, levels and body parts to move.</u>

As a warm up and some fitness start with this here.

Using the beginning of the story of 'The Iron Man', which you read in the Autumn term, think about how you could act out the scene. Here is a reminder of when he fell. Make movements with your body to look like you are now searching for the missing body parts. You are the iron man, putting yourself back together. Try to be slow and low or fast and upright. Can you move one body part at a time in isolation? Perform for at least a minute and you can record your actions and upload to Seesaw.
