CORE LEARNING TASK



MOTOR SKILLS TASK

In Motor Skills today, we are going to continue the rainbow theme. All groups are going to create a new cursive name card in rainbow colours. You could use felts, coloured pencils or even paints and a fine brush.

Use your cursive writing frame to ensure you include all the lead-ins to each letter. Remember to begin your name with a capital letter (this does not have a lead-in) and try to make your letters the correct size. (You could ask an adult to draw a dotty outline for you to trace carefully over).



MATHEMATICS TASK

In maths today we are going to think about sorting and grouping objects. First, watch this video:

Now it's time for you to create your own treasure box. You need to find an empty box and use this to collect around 20 items from around your house. Once you have collected your items, spread them out across the floor and have a go at sorting them into groups. You could use some of the ideas from the video or create your own group labels.

Talk to an adult about your reasons for grouping each set of objects together. Don't forget to put a picture of some of your groups on SeeSaw for your Key Worker to see.



PHONICS TASK

BLUES – Today's new sound: /h/ On espresso, watch the video on 'Scrap's Phonics' for /h/ On Phonics Play, play Picnic on Pluto. Select phase 2 and /h/

Lay the following sounds on the floor: h/o/p/h/u/g

Choose the correct sounds to make the following words: hop/hug

YELLOWS – join in with Miss Brown on seesaw. Ask a grown up to hide the following sounds around your home: h/i/ll/s/u/n/l/o/g/r/e/d/p/u/ff/b/u/g/ Can you find the sounds to make the following words: hill/sun/log/red/puff/bug.

Practise reading and writing the caption: get off the bus

REDS – today's new sound: /j/ On espresso, watch the video on 'Scrap's Phonics' for /j/ Lay the following sounds on the floor: j/e/t/j/a/m/j/o/g/J/a/ck Choose the correct sounds to make the following words: jet/jam/jog/Jack

Practise reading and writing the caption: get the jam

PURPLES – practise reading the word: **big**

Today we would like you to go on a digraph hunt. Ask a grown up to hide the following sounds around your home: **sh/ch/th/ng**. How many sounds can you find and say? Remember **/th/** makes two sounds: **a hard and a soft sound**.

Read the following words and place them next to the digraph you can see in each word: shop/such/this/thin/king

On espresso, search for Scrap's Phonics, select /ng/ and play the 'spelling' game.

GREENS – Practise reading the tricky words: **you/my.**

On pieces of paper, make your own flashcards and write down the digraphs: **ar/ur/oi.** Practise saying the sounds they make.

Lay the sounds on the floor and ask a grown-up to say a sound. Using a wooden spoon, tap the sound.

We would like you to go on a word hunt to find and read the following words: card/bark/hurt/surf/foil/soil/. Using your flashcards, put each word next to the correct digraph.
