Emmeline Pankhurst

1858 - 1928



Appalled by the terrible working conditions that many poor women had to endure, Emmeline realised there was an urgent need for change, and the only way to get change was by getting women the right to vote. She formed The WSPU (Women's Social and Political Union) in 1903, along with two of her daughters.

Her motto was 'deeds not words'.

"We women suffragists have a great mission - the greatest mission the world has ever known. It is to free the human race, and through that freedom save the rest."

(Emmeline Pankhurst, 17 October 1912)
