SR will have been on free CPD in order to support staff with the use of the app across all areas.	 Pupils needs are closely monitored and evaluated. Gaps in learning are identified and swift action is taken to address the needs of all pupils. Evidence for assessment for learning is closely monitored and evaluated to inform next steps in planning. The app has had technical issues this year. Staff have reported issues logging on, reporting assessments and general usage not being user friendly. As sport lead, it can give me very clear assessment data, but only if very class has inputted data for every child for every unit taught. At times, this is not happening and teacher voice indicates that assessing the children through the app is more time consuming than regular half term assessments. PE lead is spending time ensuring all data is present. Staff have commented that they like the way the app updates for planning ideas and has a good record for evidence basis. Next steps - PE lead to suggest taking the assessments from the app and use usual sheets for recording assessments. (half termly assessment sheets). Staff find the unit overviews for planning and clear targets supports teaching and learning effectively and it is a great resource to store evidence.

This year, all teachers took part in Outdoor and Adventurous training with Jess Squires. This has supported new OAA units of work being added to the curriculum. PE lead made changes to the overview of units at the start of the year, linking to the SIP (oracy). The new OAA units of work have strong links to pupils oracy skills. Y1 - 'Orienteering can be done in any space and in different areas around school. Once the children are familiar with the games they can be extended across the school grounds. Children should be physically active in all PE lessons. Children should be taught how to keep their bodies healthy and reminded of the benefits of exercise on their mood. Children all stated that they enjoyed Borwick Outdoor and Adventurous day. (3 'no' were actually children who made extra comments). Pupils will have the opportunity to compete against local schools, develop teamwork skills and apply new skills in competitive sport. Provision for enrichment is extremely high at Sherwood. We endeavour to cater for every child. There is a wide variety of clubs and enrichment and the sporting clubs we offer are widely sort after. Enrichment sign up for sports clubs fill up within minutes of them going live and we have waiting lists in place. This shows the impact of our sports provision, where children want to take part in further sporting enrichment. This year at Sherwood, a total of 339 out of 426 children 79% have attended extracurricular provision (an increase from 64% last year). 37% of children have attended at sporting enrichment. 100% of children on the SEND register have attended a sporting enrichment this year. A total of 136 children have represented Sherwood (31%) whilst competing against other schools. A total of 63% of children on the SEND register have attended as porting enrichment this year.

					Most teaching staff (80%) have offered a sporting extra-curricular club this year, showing confidence in delivering high quality sporting activities, this is an increase from 70% last year. Extra-curricular clubs have had a huge impact on children's attainment and views on competitive sport. Y4 – 'It was really fun. I wish we had won. I don't always get chosen for teams but I did this time in the trials. I was happy because I didn't think id be on the team. I think my attitude in school has changed so they chose me for the team.' Pupils will have access to high quality, purposeful uniform in order to represent Sherwood to their best ability. New uniform will play a key role in promoting pride, self-confidence, and a feeling of belonging. These factors contribute to students' wellbeing also. 2 new kits were bought this year. They are excellent quality and have been used by most children representing Sherwood. Whole new gymnastics kit was bought this year, including leotards and leggings. After pupil voice last year, it was found some children were deterred from joining gymnastics enrichment due them not wanting to wear the old leotards as they did not think they covered enough. The new kits were very well received by the gymnastics team and after showing Years 5 and 6 the new kits, more children have wanted to sign up to the enrichment. Y6 – 'I really like the new kit. The material is so much more comfortable and I felt much more confident because I was covered more than the last uniform.' Y4 – 'I felt a lot warmer and comfortable when I wore the new kit.'
