Provision will focus on games in KS2 and FMS in EYFS-Y2. This provision will also target pupils' behaviour and safety, and contribute to pupils' academic achievement, their physical wellbeing, social and emotional development. It is our aim to develop pupils' positive attitudes to learning, that can be reflected across the curriculum. Lesson planning and delivery is based on high expectations for all pupils where every learner is given opportunities to succeed. Children to become more active and support health and wellbeing.
