KEY KNOWLEDGE

By the end of this half term we would like the children to have a clear understanding of what life was like at the seaside. We would like the children to understand why seaside towns developed and what activities people carried out in their leisure time, especially in the Victorian period. We would also like children to be able to understand that every living thing goes through a series of stages and changes in their life and this is called a lifecycle.

THIS HALF TERM WE ARE READING

This half term we will be reading the story of 'The Sandhorse' written by Ann Turnbull. The children will be captivated by the magic of the story and how the sand horse sculpture wishes to join the white horses in the sea. We will also be reading a collection of other stories linked to the seaside such as 'Dolphin Boy' written by Michael Morpurgo and 'Flotsam' by David Wiesner.

WRITING FOCUS

Our writing focus this half term will be looking at and recapping our non negotiables writing skills for Year 2. These include: capital letters for the start of sentences and names of people, fulls stops at the end of sentences, practising commas in a list and revisiting contractions. In our spellings this half term, we will be looking at the following spelling rules:

- Spell words ending in -tion, e.g. station, fiction.
- The /3/ sound spelt s, e.g.

 tologician usual
- The /o/ sound spelt a after w and au, e.a. wander, augntity.
- The /3:/ sound spelt or after w, e.a. word, worm
- Spell correctly and distinguish between near homophones, quite/quiet one/won are/our of/off
- Add the ending -y where no change is needed to the root.

KEY MATHS SKILLS

In Maths we will ben learning about the different methods used when solving addition, subtraction, division and multiplication questions. These methods can be found here if you wish to practice these at home. We will also be looking at telling the time to the nearest 5 minutes. Again, any practise of this at home would benefit your child. We will also be revisiting our knowledge of money, fractions and statistics. We will also be providing opportunities to develop the children's understandings of topics further and applying their knowledge in real life situations.
