KEY VOCABULARY

KET VOCABULART	
ancient	belonging to the very distant past and no longer in existence
civilisation	the stage of human social and cultural development and organization that is considered most advanced
Egyptian	relating to Egypt or its people
mummification	a process in which the skin and flesh of a corpse can be preserved
nilometer	a graduated pillar or other vertical surface that serves to indicate the height reached by the Nile during its annual floods
pharaoh	the most important and powerful person in the kingdom
solid	firm and stable in shape; not liquid or fluid
liquid	a substance that flows freely but is of constant volume, having a consistency like that of water or oil
gas	a substance or matter having no fixed shape (unlike a solid) and no fixed volume (unlike a liquid)
particles	a minute portion of matter, eg. 'tiny particles of dust'
