KEY VOCABULARY	
physical feature	a natural feature on the surface, such as water, mountains, and deserts.
human feature	things that are built by humans such as bridges and roads
environment	the surroundings or conditions in which a person, animal, or plant lives or operates
recycling	the action or process of converting waste into reusable material
oesophagus	the muscular tube which connects the throat to the stomach.
intestines	the intestines are part of the digestive system of the body. They are sometimes called the guts or bowels.
saliva	watery liquid secreted into the mouth by glands, providing lubrication for chewing and swallowing, and aiding digestion.
canines	a pointed tooth between the incisors and premolars of a mammal, often greatly enlarged in carnivores.
molars	a grinding tooth at the back of a mammal's mouth.
incisors	a narrow-edged tooth at the front of the mouth, adapted for cutting. In humans there are four incisors in each jaw.
