### PE Task for today.

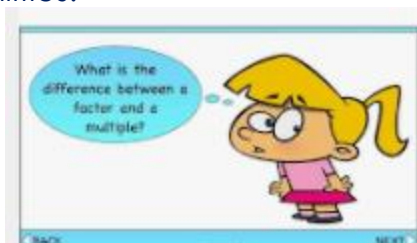
Keep yourself moving and use the task to help. We have saved a daily challenge for you to complete on the Remote learning page. Let us know how you are getting along.

### CORE LEARNING TASK FOR MATHEMATICS
